

# LESSON OPTIONS



#### From The Horse's Mouth - Science

- Discover the similarities and differences between the teeth of humans and horses.
- Covers the importance of looking after your teeth and the responsibilities horse owners have for caring for their animals' teeth.
- Uses dental footage of Bransby Horses and involves the handling of horses' teeth. (KS2)

# **Animal Adaption - Science**

- Great to follow children's prior knowledge of grouping vertebrates.
- Grouping animals according to what they eat.
- Using skull images as well as real ones, children learn to identify carnivores, herbivores and omnivores and then try to determine which animal skull is which.

(KS1 and above)



- Starting from children's rights and responsibilities, we look at animals' rights and horse owners' responsibilities through role play as Welfare Officers.
- The circumstances in which different horses are brought into the charity are used to exemplify the welfare work carried out.

(End KS1 and KS2)



 Many animals taken in by the charity are on medication. Find out how quantities of medication and feed are measured out and delivered to our residents.

(KS2)

#### How Much Does a Horse Drink? - Maths/PSHE

- Looks at daily amounts of water recommended for a person and a horse and addresses ways of getting clean water to your horse.
- Looks at animals' rights and owners' responsibilities and introduces The Five Freedoms.
- Includes relay team water race wellies and waterproofs advisable. (KS1/2)



#### How High's a Horse? - Maths

- Includes various measuring scenarios
- Compare how we measure the heights of people and horses. Equivalent measurements.
- Find out how and why we weigh the animals. Practice estimating and finding the difference in weight of different equines.

(End KS1 and KS2)







# **Donkey Data/ Pony Problem Solving - Maths**

• Real-life data handling and number problem solving around specific groups of animals -collating observable data.

(KS1/KS2)



# **My Story - English**

• Meet and greet some of Bransby Horses' residents. Gather facts about them and the charity's work, ready to create a fictional first person account of their life through their eyes, back at school. (KS1/2)

# Read All About It! - English

- Take on the role of newspaper reporters, meet and greet a couple of Bransby residents and gather facts about them to write your own reports back at school.
- Follows the pre-visit lesson on Black Beauty and/or a general introduction to newspaper report writing.
