

<u>Visitor Frequently Asked Questions 2023</u>

1. What are your opening times?

Bransby Horses is open 5 days a week Wednesday – Sunday 10am-4pm. During Lincolnshire's school holidays we are open 7 days per week. Please see the Visiting Us page of our website to see specific 7 day opening dates. We are closed Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day.

2. How many equines do you have on site?

There are approximately 250 horses, ponies, donkeys and mules on site at any one time. Not all are at the visitor centre or easily viewed so please do take advantage of our countryside walk to meet as many of them as possible! If you are looking to visit a specific equine or herd, we recommend contacting us on 01427 788464 first to avoid disappointment.

3. Are dogs allowed on site?

Absolutely! We welcome hundreds of dogs each year and have dog drinking stations around the visitor centre. Dogs are permitted in our shops and around the site, we regret that only service dogs are permitted within the main café, though there is an outside undercover seating area for families with dogs to use and a small snug area adjacent to the main cafe. We respectfully ask that dogs are not left in hot cars and that any mess is cleaned up.

4. What areas are there available to walk around?

Bransby Horses has six yards on our site over approximately 600 acres. Some of the yards are currently closed for training our equines. Please do call us to check if you are hoping to visit a specific yard or animal on 01427 788464. We have recently set up a country walk that takes you on a safe route around our site where you can enjoy the countryside and see lots of equines. You

5. Can I smoke on site?

Unfortunately smoking is not permitted on our site due to the nature of our welfare work and flammable materials across the site. There is a smoking shelter in the main visitor car park and on the roadside in front of the visitor centre and by the Clifford Marshall building on the main road through the village.

6. What do you have for Children to do?

Bransby Horses has a large play park to the rear of the visitor centre and activities suitable for ages 3-12 all year round. We change the activity trails every two months so that our regular visitors can enjoy something new each time they visit. We find that even simply popping on your wellies on a wet day, puddle jumping and exploring the countryside can provide lots of entertainment for the children.

7. Do you have gluten free and vegan options?

Yes! The café has vegetarian, vegan and gluten free options. In the gift shop, we have vegan refreshment options and most of our products are made from vegan materials too. We are currently working towards improving this further.

8. What is the café's hygiene rating?

We are proud to hold a 5* hygiene rating, last inspected in summer 2022.

9. How much does it cost to visit?

It is free to park and enter our site! We are often asked why it is free and this is because we view ourselves as a place for the entire community to enjoy, regardless of income and because we want to spread the message of equine welfare to as many people as possible. However, we do ask for donations to support us with our welfare work, rescuing, rehabilitating and rehoming equines in need. Donations can be made in the collection boxes on site, at any of our tills and through the QR codes on the signage around site. Even a small donation can make a difference, so please do consider donating when you visit. Thank you.

10. How do I book a group visit?

We are currently unable to host arranged group visits on or off site. If you would like us to contact you should this situation change, please do let us know.
