# Straight from the horse's mouth

2021 proved to be a record-breaking year for us - we rescued more equines, received more visitors and raised more money via lottery ticket sales in a single 12 month period than ever before. At the end of the year, lottery income contributed towards the We also £188,000 we spent on various aspects welcomed of our equines' ongoing care in 2021 new trustee. - from regular dentist and farrier Rosemary visits, hay, feed, bedding, rugs and Gillespie

Following the third government lockdown at the start of 2021, we were overwhelmed with rehoming enquiries. To meet this demand, we started training 'lead rein' and 'companion with potential' equines - this proved a great success and contributed to a record-breaking year for our rehoming numbers. By the end of the year we had successfully rehomed 119 equines,

Retired police horse Steele has settled in really well and the team are enjoying getting to know him. In terms of health. Steele had us concerned on a number of occasions due

> to colic and sinusitis: however, we're pleased to report that swift action and appropriate treatment has returned Steele to good health.

Nationwide fundraising relay, Horses for Health UK, raised a

whopping £17,000 for seven different equine charities in 2021. We are humbled by the 737 people who covered 2.696 miles to raise vital funds for us and others by riding, driving, walking and long-reining horses.

It's been a busy start to the year for concluding RSPCA investigations involving some of our residents, following a backlog due to the pandemic. We are pleased to be able to share news of a successful prosecution that took over one year to conclude; an equine owner in Brigg has been banned from keeping equines for 10 years after admitting

to the neglect of five ponies and donkeys now residing safely with us. All five were found knee-deep in mud, constantly itching and required intervention from both the RSPCA and The Donkey Sanctuary to secure their safety. All five have recovered well following their rescue in early 2021 read their full story and more on our website.



# TEAMWORK gets the job done

Here at Bransby Horses, we're always looking to improve our ways of working to help more equines in need. Most recently, we have done just that by advancing our response to emergencies with a newly formed support team, ready to jump into action when called.

With an increase in reports of horses and emergency welfare concerns in general over the past two years, additional support for our Welfare Team means we can increase our own capacity and provide extra help, skills or equipment to other equine welfare organisations. The new Rescue Support Team consists of current employees working across different areas of the charity.

Rachel Jenkinson, who oversees the team, said: "We've provided equipment, such as

round pens to herd animals safely, and skilled staff to support other rescue and welfare organisations. We've been able to deal with large numbers of horses that need to be health checked and transported to safety at various rescue centres and sanctuaries around the country. They've already

proven invaluable having provided emergency support to the RSPCA. It means we're now more agile in our response and able to act quickly."

The majority of work is preplanned but some is also short notice, resulting in long days with

unknown finish times in support of our colleagues in the equine welfare sector. The team are 'on call' to respond to situations, such as transportation or collection (for example of fly-grazed or abandoned animals).

emergency removal of RSPCA cases involving one or multiple equines, and supporting the Welfare Team at healthcare clinics and equine events.

Rachel continued: "As one of the UK's largest equine charities, the Bransby Horses Rescue Support Team really demonstrates our ongoing commitment to preventing and relieving the suffering of equines through rescue, providing life-long care and working with communities to improve welfare awareness across England and Wales."

Rescue & Welfare Officer, Nadine Hall, said: "It's great that we've been able to utilise the vast skill set amongst our existing teams that don't necessarily work directly in welfare roles, so we have people with different strengths across different areas of the charity, all trained



and ready to act if required."

The team have already provided instrumental support at Appleby Horse Fair, British Horse Society Healthcare and Education Clinics, assisted with equine collections for our charity and others, and RSPCA and Bransby Horses' group and individual ownership transfers.

This expansion in our offering within the equine

welfare sector was only made possible through your support. In addition to our ongoing daily care costs for our rescued residents onsite, our rescue and welfare work provides a lifeline for more equines who are suffering. Through combined efforts with other organisations, we can reach and help more animals in need.

# Phantom's story

Fearful of humans, hungry and in urgent need of veterinary care, the chances of survival were bleak for Phantom, a young pony rescued from Bodmin Moor in 2017.

Phantom arrived at Bransby Horses with six others as a foal after a hugely challenging joint rescue operation to save some 160 ponies in Cornwall.

None of the ponies had been handled or touched by human hands and were understandably terrified - and Phantom's poor, emaciated condition meant he might not survive.

Farm Manager, Lou Ewens, who was involved in Phantom's rescue said: "There was a herd of young colts who were all emaciated and in a really poor state. Phantom was one of them.

carefully monitor his food intake to increase his weight safely and he needed treatment for worms, a lice infestation and overgrown hooves.

"He was inquisitive but very timid and fearful of all human contact. After weeks of nurturing, when he was ready, he began a specialist handling programme to help him learn to trust people so essential health checks could be carried out safely, for both him and the teams."

As Phantom's handling and health progressed, his future

started to look brighter. However, it wasn't all plain sailing; Phantom's training was delayed multiple times by serious health issues causing setbacks on his road to recovery. He suffered mainly from ulcers and reoccurring colic, which is a form of stomach-ache that can be fatal in equines.

One of the complications with treating Phantom was that he was still fearful of people, and whilst the medical treatment made human interaction necessary, it was extremely challenging for us to handle him.

After years of extensive, specialised treatment he eventually turned a corner, as Phantom's rehabilitation handler, Hayley Hill explained: "One of my proudest moments with Phantom was his breakthrough when he accepted human touch for the first time without fear. Following that, we shared many more great moments together.

"I remember getting him ready for an open day a year after he joined our rehabilitation yard. I bathed and plaited him - he looked amazing and behaved impeccably in the arena with the loudspeaker and crowds of public around. He had come such a long way to reach this point and overcome so much. He was such a good boy".

To look at Phantom five years on, you would never know the long road to rehabilitation this beautiful pony has taken since his rescue. For a pony whose chances of survival were more than slim on arrival, it is an amazing achievement for both Phantom and our teams who worked so hard to provide him with a future where he is now forever safe.

Thanks to continued monthly donations, Phantom's rescue and years of rehabilitation following each setback were made possible. We are delighted to say he has recently found a loving new foster home with his Perfect Partner and is thriving as a ridden pony.

Phantom's story is just one of many examples of the cases Bransby Horses are seeing more frequently across the country, involving dozens if not hundreds of animals in need of rescue.

From the rolling Welsh Hills of Manmoel Common in South Wales to the flat landscape of Lincolnshire, Wish's journey began in 2013.

The alarm was raised when several ponies believed to be abandoned in the Valleys, were found in a poor state of health and at risk of dying of starvation.

Wish's welfare was of particular concern as she was heavily pregnant and in need of urgent medical attention. Bransby Horses agreed to take her and four others as part of the multi-agency rescue.

The necessary medical checks were carried out at our Animal Reception Centre, after which our team started to work on befriending Wish. After a lot of patience, she started to take food from their hands.

"This is always an amazing moment, when they first accept you are a friend and there to help them," said Nadine Hall, Rescue & Welfare Officer.

Two weeks later, Wish gave birth to a colt called Whisper, but things weren't easy for Wish - as she cared for her foal she struggled to put on weight. But once her foal was strong enough, she was able to focus on her own recovery.

Wish arrived with an abscess on her face which our vet team tracked to an infected tooth root, requiring extraction of diseased tissue and tooth fragments. Following her treatment she was closely monitored and recovered well, and started to settle into life at Bransby Horses.

After eight years with us, Wish, who is now 22 years old, found her forever home in time for Christmas 2021.

Finding the right home for our rescued equines is a process our Rehoming Team takes great care with. This took time for Wish but it was love at first sight for her Perfect Partner, Cat, who needed a companion pony for her mare. Pearl:

"We contacted Bransby Horses as we had just lost a companion for my old mare Pearl, not really expecting them to find anything for us. The very second we saw Wish's cheeky face we all fell in love instantly.

"We were so pleased to see that despite some initial face pulling, within a few days of her arrival she became best friends with Pearl and although nervous at the start, she could be persuaded to do anything for a treat.

"Wish has been with us now for just a little over a month and has turned into a cheeky little monkey. She canters around the field with Pearl and pulls out electric fencing to have her own personal mud bath — we know it's her from the trail of tiny little footprints and her muddy bottom.

"She has come on leaps and bounds since we've been handling her every day. She is the sweetest, cheekiest pony we could have ever wished for and I so hope she will be with us for many years to come."

Shell Craven, Team Leader at the Visitor Centre where Wish spent the majority of her eight years with us, said: "Wish was a very sweet pony who was lovely to care for. She would get nervous in some unknown situations but always trusted us to support her. It felt like forever but we are so happy she's found the perfect home — it was worth the wait. Wish's wish really did come true in the end!"

Womble is enjoying his regular walks with best friend Rodney and revelling in his new found fame as a Sponsorship Star. He's been doing well with his weight management and didn't



# An advocate for animals

Long-term supporter of Bransby Horses, Christine Mason, sadly passed away in January 2021, yet her legacy lives on thanks to the £5,000 gift she left us in her Will.

A true advocate for animal welfare all her life, Christine's generous legacy provided vital funding when our fundraising income was at an all-time low due to site closures and lack of community events as a result of the pandemic. Christine's gift enabled us to continue with our rescue and welfare work during a time of instability for the charity — a lifeline in a time of need.

Christine was born in Birmingham in 1935, and showed a passion for animals early on, owning several pets from childhood. She rescued a series of lurchers and greyhounds from appalling conditions throughout her life, and provided them with a secure and loving home to spend the rest of their lives.

Despite having a busy career working for Cadbury's Bournville Factory and later working as a lecturer with Birmingham City Council, Christine's passion for animals only grew with time. She also joined several established animal welfare organisations and proved to be an outstandingly effective fundraiser, helping to raise thousands for various charities over the years.

Christine even set up her own charity, Canine Friends, and carried out car boot sales, raffles and open garden days at her house with help from friends and family. The funds Christine raised were distributed between various animal charities near and far, including Bransby Horses and a charity which aims to stop the use of bile bears in Asia.

Sadly, Christine's final years were marred by vascular dementia, but her love of animals never wavered and even after her passing, she left instructions for her estate to be divided between several animal charities, including ours.

The gift Christine left to Bransby Horses means her legacy will always live on as she helps us to provide a second chance to so many equines in need. You too can Create Your Legacy and help shape the charity's future for generations to come, just like Christine.







Jenkinson,
explained: "We're
concerned that

owners. By March this year,

we'd already been contacted by more than 25 people asking us to take their horses in"

This figure has already exceeded the same number of requests received by the team in the entire 12 months of 2021. Half of those wanting the charity to take ownership of their horse said they needed to give them up due to financial reasons.

horses and ponies, so we're aware there are more privately owned horses in homes. Now we suspect the value of a horse may decline as the costs to keep them increase," Rachel continued.

"We urge any owner who is concerned about their horse or struggling financially, to get in touch with us to help before it becomes a problem. We may not be able to assist with taking over ownership due to our vital and primary role in urgent cases and the ongoing care of horses we rescue, but we can offer advice and support to ensure the best result for the horse."

Our role is to engage with owners to resolve issues through advice, support and education, we do not judge people's circumstances; we're here to help and to improve the welfare of equines and to ensure the best outcome for everyone.

Sadly however, we cannot always prevent abandonment and we, like many other animal welfare organisations, anticipate numbers to increase dramatically due to the cost of living crisis over the coming months. If you need our support, please get in touch today.
