


Common Equine Diseases and Conditions

STRANGLES

Pathogen: Bacteria Contagious: Yes

Zoonotic: No, but humans can get infections from the bacteria.



EQUINE INFLUENZA

Pathogen: Virus Contagious: Yes Zoonotic: Yes



EOUINE HERPES

Pathogen: Virus Contagious: Yes Zoonotic: No



RINGWORM

Pathogen: Funghi Contagious: Yes Zoonotic: Yes



PPID PITUITARY (PARS INTERMEDIA DYSREGULATION) - CUSHINGS DISEASE Endocrine disorder, hormonal disease due to changes in the pituitary gland

Symptoms: Long curly coat (hypertrichosis), holds winter coat, sweating in patches, laminitis, drinking and urinating more, fat deposits, bulging above the eyes. **Veterinary intervention:** Yes, change of management, blood tests. prescend.

Zoonotic: No



SALMONELLA

Pathogen: Bacteria Contagious: Yes Zoonotic: Yes



GRASS SICKNESS
Disease causing gut paralysis

Symptoms: Salivating, signs of colic, muscle tremors, tucked up, difficulty in swallowing, weight loss. **Veterinary intervention:** Yes, but prognosis is poor. Pain relief and treat symptoms. No cure. **Zoonotic:** No



ASTHMARespiratory condtion, allergy related

Symptoms: Coughing, wheezing, flared nostrils, difficulty in breathing at rest, heave line, nasal discharge, fatigue.

Veterinary intervention: Yes, corticosteroids, change of management, bronchodilators.



EQUINE METABOLIC SYNDROME (EMS) Hormonal disorder, Insulin dyregulation (similar to type 2 diabetes in humans)

Symptoms: Abnormal fat deposits, laminitis, difficult reducing weight, drinking and urinating more, ack of energy.

Veterinary intervention: Yes, change of management, various weight loss meds.



ARTHRITISJoint condition

Symptoms: Stiffness and pain, lameness, change in joint shape.

Veterinary intervention: Yes - pain relief, anti-inflammatory meds.



LAMINITIS Painful hoof condition

Symptoms: Heat in feet, raised digital pulse, uncomfortable on hard surface, leaning back on heels. **Veterinary intervention:** Yes, pain relief, change of management.



RAIN SCALD/MUD FEVER Skin conditions

Symptoms: Raised tufts of hair and skin, crusty scabs. bald, sore areas, swelling and heat in lower legs. Veterinary intervention: Yes, diagnose reason, change of management.



COLIC Abdominal pain and discomfort

Symptoms: Pawing at the ground, rolling, restless, looking at stomach, kicking at belly, change in number and consistency of droppings, sweaty patches Veterinary intervention: Yes, rectal examination, stomach tubing, pain relief, antispasmodic, IV fluids. surgery.
